The Waiting Room

There are toys and books
in the waiting area.

An adult will always be with me in this room.

I can read, play or relax while I wait.

My parent or caregiver will
fill out paperwork.

I can have snacks here too.



The waiting area is a safe place.

The Interview



This room is a safe place.

I will go to a room where the adult at A Child's Voice will listen, get to know me, and ask some questions.

It is important to tell the truth.

I can ask the adult questions too.

I can take a break at any time.

The cameras are there to help them remember everything I say.

Back to the Waiting Area

I may play in the waiting room after my interview.

My parent or caregiver may talk with an adult in another room.



It is safe for me here.

The Check-Up Room

I may see a nurse at A Child's Voice for a check-up.

Another adult will help the nurse and take pictures.

The camera is there to help remember everything they see.

The nurse will check my whole body and explain everything to me, so I feel safe.

I can ask the nurse any questions I have about my body.



The check-up room is a safe place.

All done!



It is safe for me here.

After I see the nurse, the adults might talk in a different room.

I can play again in the waiting room.

A Child's Voice is safe for me.

If I have questions, I can ask someone when I arrive.
